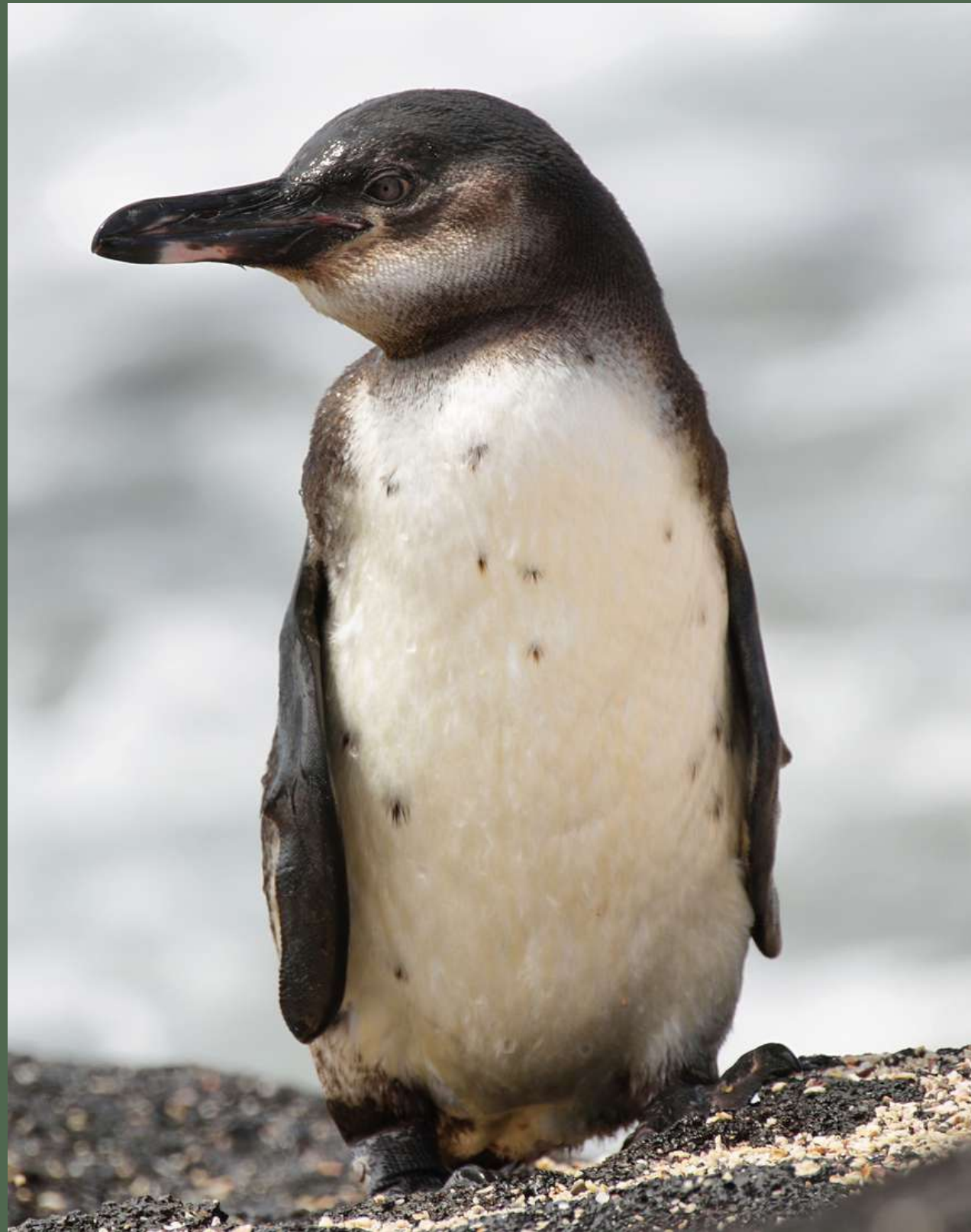

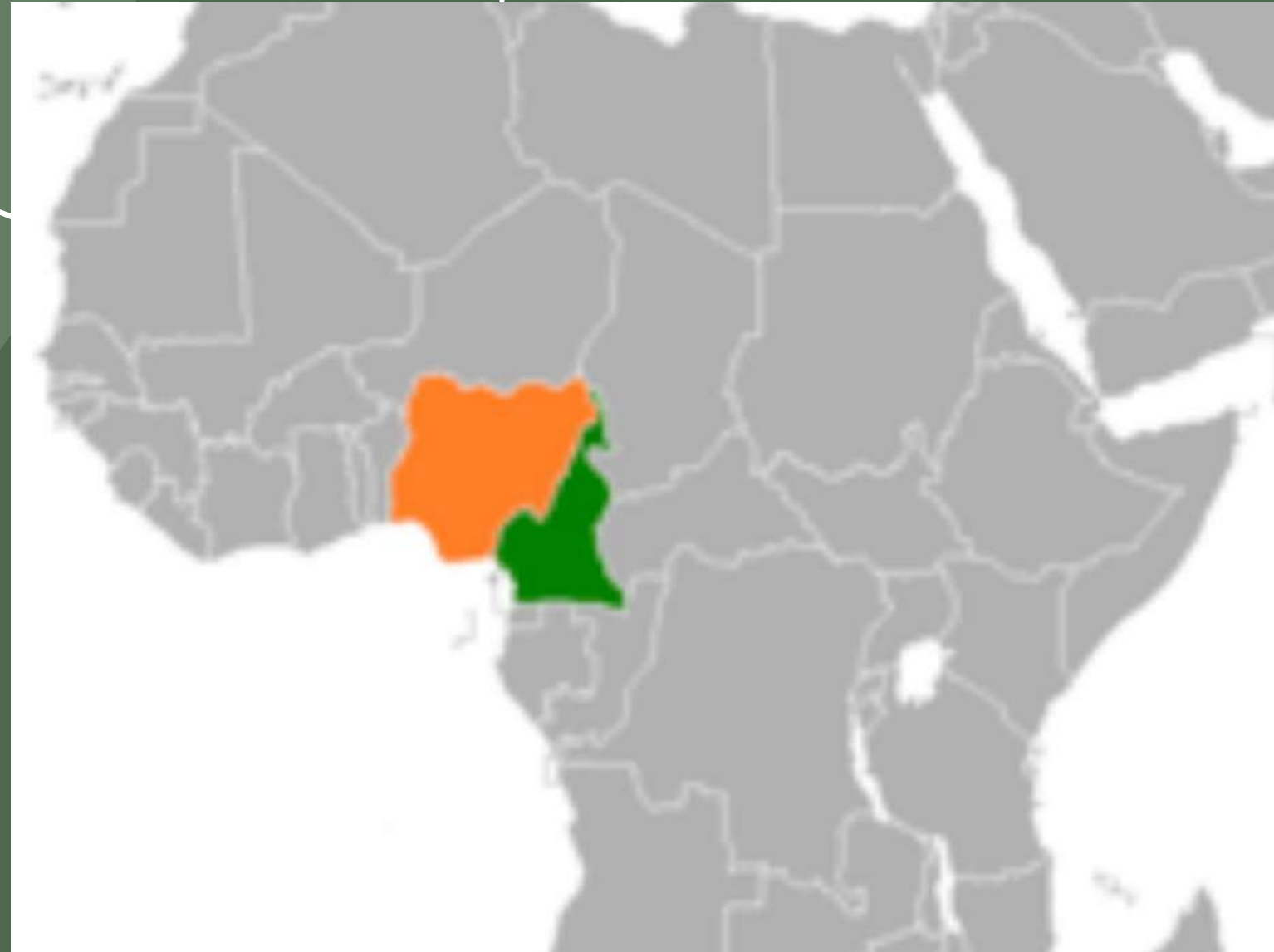


Cross river gorilla

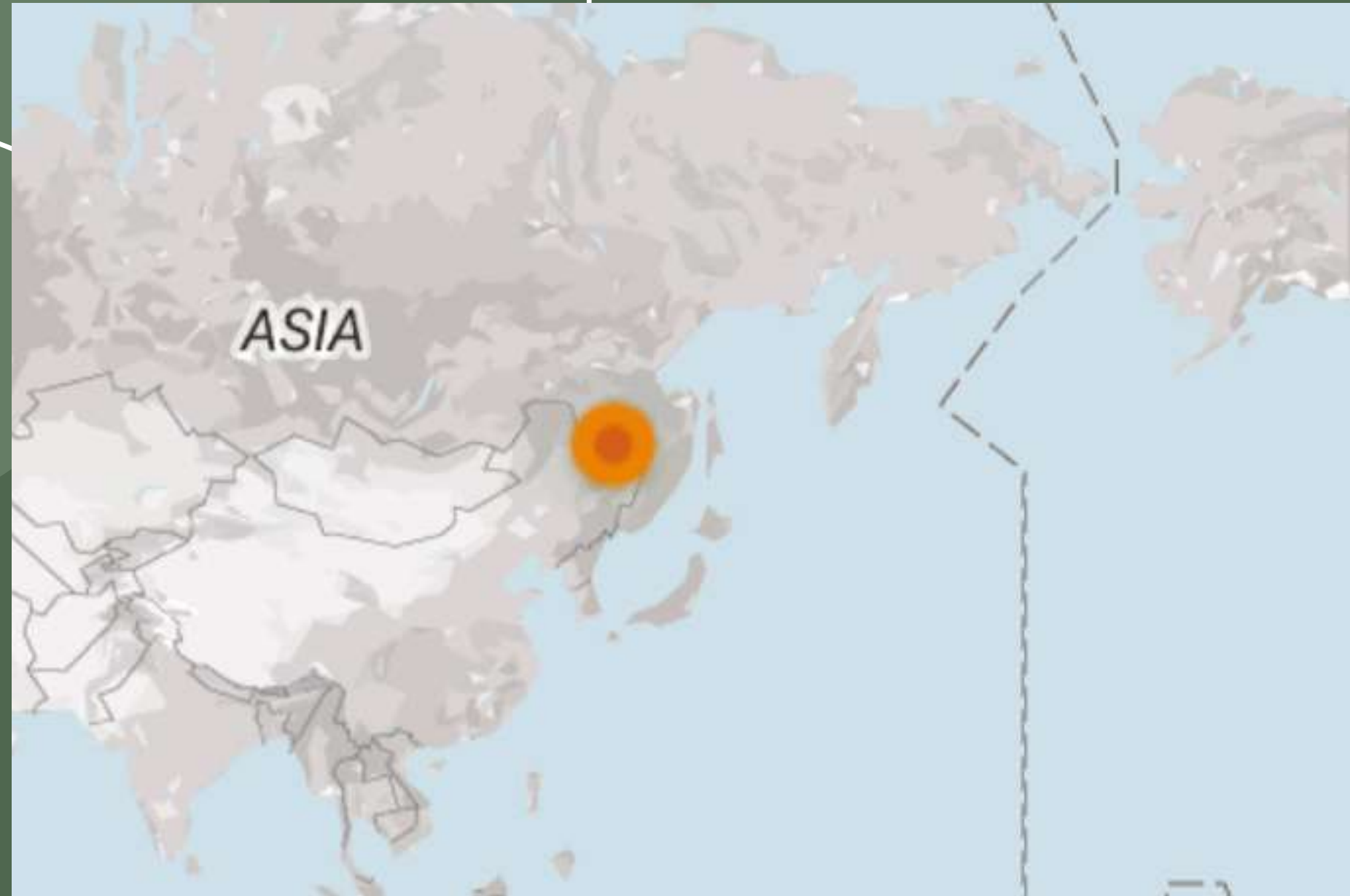


Amur Leopard
